

Time to Listen

We live in a society that can be very stressful. Perhaps a relationship has broken down or you have been bereaved. Sometimes the stress of hard working lives has become unmanageable. Many of us experience difficulties and anxieties, which we feel we cannot sort out on our own.

Time to Listen provides a safe place for someone to come as they are and tell their story.

What happens in the listening session?

Whatever the problem, talking with someone trained to listen sensitively and sympathetically, can help to understand it. Your Listener will not judge you in any way or give advice but will be alongside you as you explore your situation.

The session would normally last no more than an hour. If you need more time, your Listener would be happy to arrange another appointment.

Confidentiality

We offer complete confidentiality. This means that the Listeners treat as confidential all personal details and circumstances of your life which might result in your identification to anyone else. This does not extend to situations where there is a serious threat to your own life or that of another or the likelihood of a serious offence being committed.

The Listener's Training

Our team of Listeners have undergone training by Acorn Christian Trust* and are recognised as Acorn Christian Listeners. They are all CRB checked and given regular supervision.

Listening is not the same as counselling, though for some it may be a stepping stone to counselling elsewhere.
